Below you will be able to see our allocated funding each year, and you will also be able to see details of the spending and impact of this funding.

As a school we need to ensure that we are committed to developing PE, sports and healthy lifestyles for our pupils even if the funding stops or changes. We will achieve this by ensuring that some of the funding is being spent on staff training. Staff that receive this training will be able to disseminate their training to other staff members. This will ensure that all lessons, taught by all of our staff will be of a high standard.

Good quality equipment will need to be purchased that will last a number of years, our children will be taught how to use the equipment and reminded to treat it respectfully to ensure it lasts.

Playground markings	£1200	Playground markings on the school playground have been updated. This encourages the children to have at least 30 minutes of physical activity a day as recommended.
Purchase of further games resources to update existing stores and ensure there are sufficient for a staff.	£3000	In order to make good progression in games skills, children need access to the correct equipment which is in good order. Provide further resources for the YR R play ground.
Purchase of further play time equipment and storage for resources.		More equipment at playtimes allows all children to access the 30 minutes a day of physical activity recommended. New storage areas means that children can access equipment independently and therefore offers more opportunities for physical activity.

Thus, achieving higher outcomes.
PE kit for Staff	£1000	Improves modelling for children during and outside of lessons with all staff in the correct clothing. This in turn raises the standard of P.E lessons and improves the lesson outcomes for every child.
New curriculum plans, CPD for all staff, Observation time for PE lead.	£3600	PE funding has been secured for the next academic year but it is import to see how we can use this money to secure sporting outcomes and high-level PE lessons for years to come. Therefore, this money will be best spent on investing in our staff. Through inset training and new whole school planning. The PE leader has used staff audits to inform training and ensure all lessons are high quality.
