#### **End of Key Stage One Assessments**

This table below shows the percentage of eligible children at the end of Key Stage 1 achieve Age Related Expectations (ARE) at Hook Infant School in 2025. The number of eligible children is 107. We are very proud of our children's academic achievements but also the tremendous progress and effort each child has made on their journey through the school. I would like to wish each and every child in Year 2 much success in the future and "Thank You" for being such an amazing year group.

#### **Phonics Screening**

As many of you may be aware, Year 1 pupils and those children in Year 2 who did not pass when they were in Year 1, have to undergo the government's national phonic screening test. The children are required to segment and then blend forty real or alien words. The table below indicates the results for those children in Year 1 who took the test this year.
