Each week please continue to carry out these basic skills when you can:

- Marvellous Maths activities Practise adding a 2-digit number to another 2-digit number
 e.g. 34 + 61 =
- Reading 10 minutes a day shared or independent.
- Spelling Use a mixture of **prefixes e.g. un, dis, re, in, mis.**

Week 5: The topic for this week is: Author Research – Oliver Jeffers

English – Can you create an Oliver Jeffers fact-file? You could find out what type of books he writes, if he illustrates, how old he is, where he lives, what are his hobbies etc. Have you read any of his stories before? You could sequence the story or complete the comprehension questions about his story. In school we would share two books of his: Lost and Found and The Way Back Home, however he has many more books you can look at and research. Can you find a theme in his books? Maths – Could your child complete a mental arithmetic booklet independently (this could be over a few days). After marking the booklet your focus could then be on anything they found tricky.



Arrange your sticks on a piece of card and super glue them to the card (make sure you are happy with the shape before you start gluing!) You could then always paint your sticks too if you wish.
