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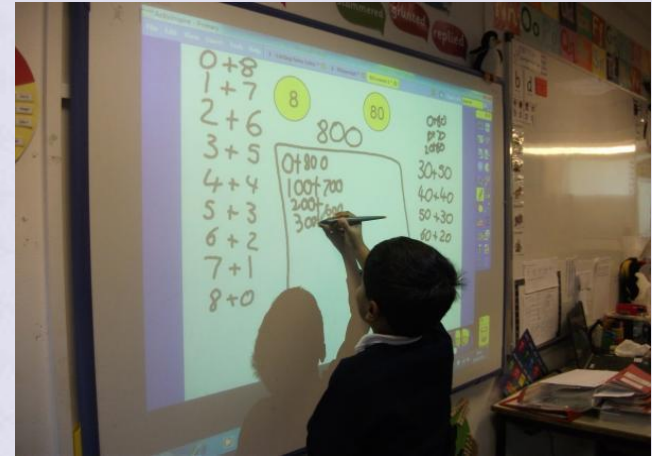
# School Organization


- Early Years Foundation Stage also known as Year R, have their own purpose built block with a covered outside learning area.
- Key Stage 1 (Years 1 & 2).
- 4 form entry (120 children).
- Every class has a teacher and Learning Support Assistant.
- Plan as year groups.
- PPA time is covered by qualified teachers.
