



### Hook Infant School PE and Sports Premium Funding Statement

The government allocates additional funding for schools to use to develop PE and sports and to ensure they develop healthy life styles in pupils. This money is ring-fenced and schools will be held to account about how the funding has impacted on the provision of PE and sports and the sustainability of this impact. Below you will be able to see our allocated funding and details of the spending and impact of this funding.

As a school we need to ensure that we are committed to developing PE, sports and healthy lifestyles for our pupils even if the funding stops or changes. We will achieve this by ensuring that some of the funding is being spent on staff training. Staff that receive this training will be able to disseminate their training to other staff members. This will ensure that all lessons, taught by all of our staff will be of a high standard.

Good quality equipment will need to be purchased that will last a number of years our children will reminded about how to use the equipment respectfully to ensure it lasts.

<b>Football after school club to restart.</b>	N/A	Following Covid-19 restrictions being lifted further we will be restarting our after-school football club. This is run by an external company, who deliver high quality, fun football sessions. These sessions improve children's physical ability but also their self-esteem, cooperative and teamwork skills.
<b>Further sports coaching.</b>	£3,500	Following the lockdowns caused by the Covid-19 outbreak. Children have not had as much opportunity to take part in sport as in previous years. This is due to sporting restrictions, park closures and people being advised to stay at home. Currently we offer football as an after-school club. We would like to offer other activities to encourage the children to be as active as possible.
<b>Staff training</b>	£600	PE lead to receive PE training, and disseminate this to staff team. This will allow staff to deliver high quality lesson therefore, enabling high outcomes for all children.
<b>Playdale upkeep</b>	£13,040	Due to Covid-19 regulations our playdale trim trail was not used for a large part of last year. During a Health and Safety inspection we found that the fence surrounding the playdale had deteriorated which made the playdale unsafe to use. Full replacement of the fence around the playdale is necessary, to ensure it remains safe for the children to use. The fence will be replaced with sleepers, which are more sustainable then the original posts.



<b>Purchase of further games resources to update existing stores and ensure there are sufficient for a staff.</b>	£500	In order to make good progression in games skills, children need access to the correct equipment which is in good order.
<b>Playground play leaders. Time out of class for staff to organise and teach the playground buddies games.</b>	£300	New playground equipment has been purchased for the children to use on the playground outside of PE lessons allowing children to extend and apply their developing skills away from formal PE lessons. Thus, achieve higher outcomes. The funding will also be used to purchase hats to denote the sports leaders on the playground.
<b>Scooter training</b>	£460	Many of our children scoot to school this training will teach children about scooter safety on the roads. It not only promotes safety but also an active lifestyle. It will encourage children to scoot to school rather than travel by car, therefore improving their health. This is something the PE lead was looking into previously due to COVID-19 however, this could not take place.
<b>Skipping workshop</b>	£300	We will be having a skipping workshop visit this year. KS1 children will get the opportunity to learn new skipping skills and tricks. A skipping rope playground bundle will be purchased in order for the children to continue to practise their new skills.
<b>Year R climbing equipment</b>	£14,000	The Early Years outdoor area will be getting their own trim trail equipment. This will be accessed by the children during all free flow activities. The Early Years children will be able to use the equipment to develop their motor skills and extend their physical abilities.
<b>Green Gym</b>	£100	The school Green Gym will help children to increase their level of physical activity through practical environmental tasks in school grounds. This activity will run as an after school or lunch club. This will help engage children who are reluctant to engage in traditional sporting activities. Green Gym will provide children with the opportunity to build muscle and increase stamina therefore, improve PE outcomes.
