Maths – Can you look at time over the next couple of weeks. Can you tell the time using o'clock? Half past? Quarter past? Quarter to? You could try and tell the time at different times of the day over the summer holidays to practise! Time is tricky but the more we do it the better and more confident we get at it. We have attached some time sheets too.

Science – Mr Grinling loves to eat cake! And lots of other treats. Can you make some cakes and treats at home over the next few weeks and talk about whether a reversible or irreversible change happens? For example – chocolate can be melted into a liquid and put back in the fridge to change back to cold chocolate. This is a **reversible** change as it can go back and forth. However, when you make a cake

with all the ingredients you cannot get those ingredients all back so it is an **irreversible** change. How many can you discuss and find out about over the next couple of weeks? Maybe you could make a tally and see how many are reversible and how many are irreversible. Have fun!

Some ideas include: ice, popcorn and steam from a kettle.

PE – You could look at a range of the previous activities set and complete a few throughout the week. These included: nature walks, running, cosmic yoga, Andy's Wild Workouts, Joe Wicks workouts and playing outside. Links are on previous home-learning pages. Enjoy!
